### **Jean-jacques rousseau (1712-1778 )**

Rousseau's conception of the social contract is quite complex on the one hand, it was concerned primarily with the problem of freedom with conceiving a form of government which protected the liberty and rights of all citizens (the subtitle of The Social Contract is Principles of Political Right)

Rousseau stresses nonetheless that the contract can be revoked at any moment, that representative government is fundamentally vicious and illegitimate and proffers his opinion that the small state is everywhere preferable to the large one Rousseau's contribution to the meaning of Democracy will therefore be crucial

### **Jean-Jacques Rousseau**

Rousseau believed that a government's purpose is to protect liberty, or freedom, and to help people get along Rousseau believed that the best form of government was a democracy His writings influenced how people think about government and how a democracy should work A Social Contract
